2018 TEACHER MINI-GRANT PROGRAM

The mini-grant program is a special project of the Women's Leadership Committee.

Purpose: Mini-grants are offered to elementary school teachers to initiate new programs. Annually, a total of \$1,000 is available.

Eligibility: Mini-grants are offered to elementary school teachers on a competitive basis with priority given to those teachers demonstrating a need for financial support.

Application Guidelines:

- Applications must be completed and submitted to the Idaho Farm Bureau Women's Leadership Committee by March 1, 2018.
- Recipients of the grants will be announced by April 15th.
- Those projects selected for mini-grants will receive one-half at the beginning of the project and the balance upon completion of the project and submission of a final written report to the IFB Women's Leadership Committee.
- Teachers are limited to one application per year.

Selection Criteria:

- Following Directions
- Postmarked before Deadline
- Shows a need for financial support
- Is a new project for the county

Submission:

- Return completed application to your County Farm Bureau Women's Chairman. She will forward the application to the state offices.
